



LEARNIN & SHORT **COURSES**

Mark Murphy is the Co-ordinator of Professional and Distance Learning based at Croydon College. Here he explains what Distance Learning and Short Courses are all about and why you should consider one.

What are Distance Learning and Short Courses? Why should people do this?

Distance Learning is a provision which enables learners to complete studies from the comfort of their own home. This provides flexibility for those who have full-time jobs or are busy with childcare, but can still gain a recognised qualification. Our courses cover a range of subjects across 3 Levels which are perfect for learning new skills and gaining valuable knowledge that looks good on your CV.

Short Courses are ideal for those who want to find new hobbies. Some courses will provide a general introduction to a subject whereas others will provide more of an in-depth understanding, recognisable with an awarding body certificate upon completion.

For a Distance Learning course, there are no specific entry requirements for Level 1 and 2; however, learners should have a minimum of Level 1 in literacy or equivalent. For Level 3 courses, learners are expected to hold a related Level 2 qualification. All learners must successfully complete an induction booklet. Some courses may also require you to be working in a relatable role for witness testimonies.

For a Short Course, generally there are no specific entry requirements, however some courses hold individual entry requirements but all learners are expected to hold a good level of Maths and English

How do they work?

Distance Learning Courses allow you to study and gain your qualification. Once enrolled you will be sent an email in which you will then have access to an e-learning platform. This provides you with lesson materials and end of unit assignments that contribute to your end qualification. There are no formal exams at the end.

Short Courses are delivered here at Croydon College and our evening study day is on a Wednesday. Throughout the course, you will be supported through practical and theory based tasks by your tutor in the classroom. You will need to successfully complete a workbook or assessment which will be presented to the awarding body for certificates to be issued.

Both courses provide an opportunity to develop new and existing skills as well as their CVs. They also support progression into full time courses into the College or other pathways.

Anyone over the age of 19 and has lived in the UK for over 3 years can apply for a Distance Learning and Short Course.

There are many different available courses for you to choose from so make sure you pick the right one. If you need advice on what course is right for you, don't hesitate to contact us, as we would be happy to help.

What do you enjoy most about your role?



Eight Croydon College Hair & Beauty students had the opportunity of visiting Seville on the Erasmus+ Programme, keep reading to find out who, what, where, when and why they were there!

In the early morning of the 3rd of November – eight excited Croydon College students made their way to Gatwick Airport to board their flight to the southern city of Spain, Seville!

Seville is the capital of its region, Andalucia, and the cultural and financial centre of southern Spain. Upon arrival the students had their induction meeting where they were briefed on all things Seville, including their schedules for the next two weeks of their work experience. Shortly after, they went on a local tour to explore the beautiful city of Seville, to ensure they knew their way around prior to starting their placements.

After an amazing first day gallivanting around Seville, the students all headed back to the hostel, where they had their first meal together to celebrate a successful but adventurous first day in Seville.

The following day all eight students took a Spanish language class and then headed to their work placements organised by Erasmus. Interested? - Keep reading to find out how you can get on the programme!

The Erasmus Programme is a European Union student programme established in 1987 run in the UK by the British Council. Since then more than 2 Million students have studied or worked in Europe on the ERASMUS exchange programme. They also have a new programme called Erasmus+ combining all the EU's current schemes for education, training, youth & sport which was started in 2014.

Erasmus+ supports the professional development of people in vocational education and training (VET) through training periods abroad through work placements. The placements are subject to the curriculum of the participating institutions. Such as hair & beauty, customer services, sport, construction, catering and hospitality and social care amongst others.

To be eligible for an Erasmus traineeship you must be in a participating study programme or have graduated within one year. So as long as you are in higher education institution, (don't worry you don't have to be a language student) and your University or College offers Erasmus for your subject, you can apply.

They both acquired new skills and methods of different European techniques and how to use different instruments for beauty.




Students: Chen



Meet Sarah Msouhli – a student that chose to enrol in Mathematics, French and Hospitality at Coulsdon Sixth Form College after completing her GCSE's at Norbury Manor High School. Learn more about why she chose Coulsdon Sixth Form College and her experience throughout so far...

Why did you decide to study here at Coulsdon Sixth Form College?

I had a friend who'd applied and told me I should join her. I attended the open event and spoke too many of the friendly teachers who made me feel so welcome. From then, I knew it was the College for me

How did you find the course you studied at Coulsdon?

I already had an idea of what I wanted to study-Maths because I thoroughly enjoyed it at GCSE, French as a result of my Moroccan background, Hospitality for my love of food and communication with people, and Spanish as I wanted to expand my knowledge of other languages.

You were selected for a Trip to America – Tell me about this.

I discovered the trip a year earlier and heard that it was a great opportunity. From then, I applied and I got accepted. The trip was in July 2019, and spread over 2 parts. For 1 week, we stayed at a summer camp in Virginia with people from various backgrounds. Whilst we were there, we took part in a range of workshops, trips and often spoke about world issues. For 2 weeks, we stayed in Chicago

where people kindly opened up their homes for us to stay. When we were there, we visited various grassroots & refugee organisations, and visited the charity After School Matters which provides high school teens opportunities to explore and develop their talents, while gaining critical skills for work, college and beyond.

What did you learn over there?

The America trip taught me a lot. One of those things is that integration is important to society as we are all social creatures. It also allowed me to open my eyes to the issues of the world and that everyone should have access to a safe environment where we can talk about these issues. I learnt how to act independently (as I had to use public transport on my own).

What are your plans after College?

I'm currently looking at Apprenticeships or internships in food journalism or other areas of hospitality.

Have you been involved in extra-curricular activities?

Yes, I took part in the Network for Teaching and Entrepreneurship Business Camp. This was an intense workshop learning about how businesses work and how to pitch. We had the chance to go to London to show what we had learnt, where we won the local programme against other groups from London. As a result, we got to go to Budapest to compete internationally. This opportunity built my interest in business and enhanced my public speaking skills. I also volunteered as a mentor for the next year group.

Do you have any advice for students coming to study here?


