

## UCC Student Results for academic year 2019/20

Results for all undergraduate programmes for academic year 2019/20 will be available on My PT Markbook from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2020 at 4pm.

This release is for undergraduate programmes validated by the University of Sussex.

### How to access my results:

- Log into Moodle and click on MyPT (My Progress Tracker)
- This will take you to your results (Markbook) area
- Select 'My Markbooks' and refer to the [Subject Comment](#) area.

*Here you will be able to view your results and see if you have progressed or have been awarded your degree.*

### How to interpret my results:

You need 120 credits to progress to the next stage of your programme.

If you have not passed 120 credits, then you will most likely have to resubmit assignments for modules you have not passed. *(This may vary based on each student's individual academic performance).*

The No Detriment policy and process has been applied and verified by the Chair of the External Assessment Board, the Sussex Partnership Manager, the external examiners and the Head of Higher Education to ensure fair application. 'Mark uplifted' refers to where you have qualified for your overall module mark to be raised in line with the policy.

Please note, it is your responsibility to view your results and raise any queries in a timely manner.
